1. The boat is going to Castle Island where Mary Queen of Scots was imprisoned in 1547.

After a number of attempts she finally escaped in 1548 by being dressed as a servant and being rowed back to the shore of Loch Leven, Kinross.

2. This is one of the new 'birders' hides overlooking the lagoons just north of Musselburgh racecourse.

3. This is Benarty Hill on the south side of Loch Leven in Fife.

The picture was taken from the M90, looking south.

4. This is the Abernethy tower.

The tower was built in the late 11th century and there are only two of this Irish Celtic type in Scotland, the other being in Brechin. William the Conqueror met Malcolm Canmore here in 1072. Sadly this town has nothing to do with Abernethy biscuits.

5. This is the 'Imp' in Cockenzie House garden, Cockenzie.

6. This is Burleigh Castle near Milnathort, Fife.

The main part you see was built in 1582 and was the family home to the Balfours.

7. Sharon's very attractive little shop is at the eastern end of Market Street in Haddington.

8. This is the busy little harbour of St Abbs located between Dunbar and Berwick-on-Tweed.

9. Emily is famous for being a very active suffragette campaigner. She lost her life in the end after throwing herself under the king's horse at the Epsom Derby in 1913.

She is tipping her bowl to show she didn't eat any food whilst when in prison on hunger strike knowing that she would then be forced to undergo the 'torture' of force feeding. Much later, in 1928, women over 30 who owned property were entitled to vote.

10. A difficult one; this is the quay for the Isle of Coll in the Inner Hebrides, west of Mull.
